



University of California Press (UC Press) is seeking individual or co-editor applications for the editorship of *Latin American and Latinx Visual Culture* (LALVC). Applicant(s) appointed to this position will succeed founding Editor-in-Chief, Charlene Villaseñor Black.

Latin American and Latinx Visual Culture is a quarterly, online only peer-reviewed journal dedicated to publishing the most current international research on the visual culture of Mexico, Central America, South America, and the Caribbean, as well as that created in diaspora. A defining focus of the journal is its concentration of current scholarship on both Latin American and Latinx visual culture in a single publication. The journal aims to approach ancient, colonial, modern and contemporary Latin American and Latinx visual culture from a range of interdisciplinary methodologies and perspectives. Now in its fifth volume, LALVC was awarded Best New Journal by the Council of Editors of Learned Journals in 2020 and a PROSE award for best new journal from the Association of American Publishers.

Applicants should have a Ph.D. in art history, or a related field, and a distinguished scholarly record. Previous journal editorial experience is preferred, but not required. Applicants should possess strong organizational and management skills, the ability to work with others, and a commitment to publishing high quality, relevant, and engaging scholarship. Applicants should be available to assume editorship by January 2024 or shortly thereafter.

Primary responsibilities of the Editor/Co-Editor include:

- Solicitation of quality research and other scholarly work for the journal
- Managing all aspects of the peer review and publication process
- Making final decisions on manuscripts
- Reviewing copy editing and page proofs as necessary
- Ensuring editorial workflows and processes run smoothly
- Appointing and collaborating with Editorial Board members
- Meeting with UC Press staff regularly to discuss various aspects of journal publishing, journal promotion, and other journal projects

UC Press offers a modest stipend for editorial support for this position.
